

Sports Premium Funding

Notley Green Primary School 2019/20

In April 2013, the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport announced new funding of £150 million to support the delivery of PE and school sport. Funding is being allocated to all state-maintained secondary, primary, middle and special schools (including non-maintained special schools), academies and pupil referral units with primary aged pupils. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of P.E. and sport in schools.

Summary of Sports Premium spending 2018/19

Key objectives of Sports Premium spending:

- To broaden the knowledge and skills of the staff to deliver high quality lessons.
- To provide new and update current equipment to support staff in delivering high quality Physical Education.
- To transport children to and from sporting fixtures.
- To provide extra-curricular clubs for all children in Years 1-6 from a range of professional coaches.
- To encourage SEN children to participate in sports.
- To encourage all children to be active at play time through the introduction of play leaders and through the introduction of new sports and activities.
- To ensure Notley Green pupils are able to participate in a range of competitive school sports.

Impact of spending:

- Rising Stars PE is used by all staff to ensure high quality lessons are delivered. Sports Coach has mentored and observed staff to offer support and improve practice.
- New equipment has been purchased to support delivery of lessons for all groups of pupils.
- Active8 after-school club has encouraged disadvantaged pupils and those less likely to be active to participate in a range of sports.
- A wider range of Sports Clubs have been offered after school, including Boot Camp, for those children who wish to be active but struggle with team sports and specific skills. 402 places were offered for children to participate in a Sports Club.
- 434 sports competition spaces were attended in the academic year.
- 53 SEN children have participated in extra-curricular activities or through representing the school in sporting competitions.

- The quality of the P.E. curriculum has improved due to support from the sports coach and investment in a scheme
